## **VET DELIVERY**

No need to become an RTO, (Registered Training Organisation). Dance Factory delivers the VCE VET Dance-Certificate II in Dance program to secondary schools with a range of options. The options are non exclusive and at any one point, schools may adopt a range of models that are best suited to the needs of the school community.

The arrangements for the delivery of the dance program will be dependent upon a range of factors, including:

- The school's ability to meet the resource requirements outlined in the training package.
- Availability of professionally trained and experienced staff in the vocation of dance.
- Ability to conduct workplace and simulated environment assessment of competencies in a cost effective manner.
- Potential to expose students to a wide range of training forums.

Dance Factory is committed to delivering high quality vocational dance programs, with over 25 years experience we have developed the perfect infrastructure to support successful study and social development for young people studying dance through the VCE VET and VCAL programs.

We also deliver the VCE Dance program on Mondays and Wednesday's 4:30 – 6:30pm. More information is available if you have students that wish to undertake a more theoretical approach to their study of dance.

## **PROGRAM OPTIONS**

VCE VET programs are designed to provide a more vocational VCE, linking them to industry needs.

Our VCE VET Dance program expands the opportunities for senior secondary students as the study will prepare these young people for the workplaces of the future. This is achieved through the provision of nationally recognised training qualifications that have been integrated into the VCE.

All training qualifications are derived from the Australian Qualifications Framework and are either delivered or auspiced by Dance Factory.

### **VET Block Credit Recognition (BCR)**

Students with a full or partial completion of a nationally recognised Vocational Education and Training or Further Education (VET/FE) qualification may be eligible for credit towards the VCE.

Students are eligible for credit if they have completed, or are completing, training in a nationally recognised VET/FE qualification that is not recognised in the suite of approved VCE, VET and School Based Apprenticeships and Traineeships programs.

Under Block Credit Recognition, credit toward the VCE is determined by the AQF level at which the units of competency/modules are recognised and the nominal hours of training completed.

The following guidelines apply:

- Attainment of units of competency at AQF level II provides credit at Units 1 and 2 level.
- Attainment of units of competency at AQF level III or above provides credit at Units 3 and 4 level.
- 90 nominal hours of training is required for each VCE VET Unit.
- Where available, a Units 3 and 4 sequence will be awarded on satisfactory completion of 180 nominal hours at AQF level III.
- **VTAC may award students who receive a Units 3 and 4 sequence through Block Credit Recognition, a fifth or sixth study increment towards their ATAR. This increment will be 10% of the average of the Primary Four scaled studies.**

EXAMPLE of a STUDENT'S study of dance-

Year 10 commence study VCE VET Dance Units 1 and 2 – partial completion of Certificate II in Dance

Year 11 continue study VCE VET Dance Units 3 and 4 – complete Certificate II in Dance and partial completion of Certificate III in Dance.

Year 12 commence BCR program- Complete 180 hours of units from Certificate III in Dance. To be eligible for credit, as stated in **bold** above, the student must be enrolled in VCE.

Students who have been enrolled in VCE within the previous two years may also be eligible for credit.

These options are also available for students undertaking VCAL to meet the vocational component.

## SCHOOLS IN PARTNERSHIP WITH DANCE FACTORY

### **Full Delivery:**

Students attend the full program at Dance Factory – delivery times are flexible with students able to attend on the official VCE VET day of Wednesday or alternatively, with approval, they can make up their own schedule from our day, night or Saturday classes to create a full VCE VET Dance program.

### **Full Auspice Delivery:**

Delivery by the school of the whole program, under the auspice of Dance Factory:  
A secondary school can negotiate with Dance Factory to deliver the program, where the school can demonstrate access to suitable staffing, facilities and resources. VET clusters can also be formed. Clusters allow participating schools to improve the provision of VET programs as schools share facilities and staff expertise. Increased numbers of students provide viable class sizes. With a cluster arrangement students from one school may attend another school auspiced by Dance Factory to undertake their training.

**Other delivery:** arrangements can be provided at an additional cost. For example Dance Factory can provide teachers and assessors to the secondary school.

**MOU/Agreement**

Dance Factory will prepare the Contract/Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the secondary school and Dance Factory as the Registered Training Organisation (RTO). This document will outline and clarify the roles and responsibilities of all parties involved in the design of the course work, the delivery and assessments.

The signing of the MOU by Dance Factory's Administrative Director (or her/his appointed nominee) and the secondary schools Principal/Vet Co-ordinator (or her/his appointed nominee) formalises the partnership arrangements.

The home school is responsible for enrolling their students with the VCAA and for entering student results on VASS according to VCAA timelines.




### **ARTICULATION & PATHWAYS**
