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DANCE FACTORY TEACHERS ACADEMY SYLLABUS (DFTA)

What is DFTA?

The syllabus is comprised of:

8 Levels of:

Jazz

Tap

Ballet

Hip Hop

Contemporary

Elementary Teachers Exam - For teaching Beginner to Intermediate & Levels 1-4.

Intermediate Teachers Exam - For teaching Intermediate to Advanced & Levels 1-6.

Advanced Teachers Exam - For teaching Advanced & Levels 7-8.

Levels 1 - 4 Preliminary exams for young children

Each level/style comprises of:

Jazz, Ballet & Tap

- * 2 tracks of set exercises
- * 4 sets of travelling combinations
- * 1 Dance

Preliminary levels in all styles-vary

- * 1 or 2 tracks of set exercises
- * 4 sets of travelling combinations
- * 1 Dance

Hip Hop & Contemporary

- * 4 sets of travelling combinations
- * 1 Dance

Teachers can also use their own dance instead of our set work (certain criteria will apply e.g. Levels 1 & 2 must show a single turn & Levels 3 & 4 must show a double turn).

History

The syllabus was introduced in 1982 as "Academy of Teachers Dancing" (A.O.T.D). In 1991, the name was changed to "Dance Factory Teachers Academy" (D.F.T.A), under the direction of Dulcie Lee.

It was devised with the help of physiotherapists, chiropractors and dance teachers to be kept in line with Safe Dance Policies. However, we must realise that we are teaching dance, not just fitness, and the body must be prepared to accept the stress today's dance demands.

The syllabus is regularly updated. Technical skills were advanced, there was an introduction of travelling combinations and new music tracks were applied to increase the popularity with students of today.

All styles have been carefully developed with a planned progression to increase skill, co-ordination and flexibility at an appropriate pace. Students find their abilities to adapt to different styles will be increased.

The DFTA syllabus has been devised so that teachers can use it as their class plan. The gradual learning of dance technique from the beginner to advanced standard through each level, gives dancers and teachers a comprehensive and safe understanding of the body.

Teacher/School Registration

All teachers must register with Dance Factory by 30th March each year, please returned the attached form along with the annual registration fee of \$600.

Teacher Requirements

1. To teach the syllabus:

You must have either a

- DFTA teaching qualification or
- A teaching qualification in another syllabus or
- Certificate IV in Dance Teaching or
- Diploma of Dance Teaching.

Teachers only need to have a teaching qualification in 1 style in order to teach any DFTA style.

OR Dance Factory has a register of qualified DFTA teachers you can employ to teach the syllabus

- 2. Teachers are asked to revise any levels they will be teaching each year.
- 3. Discrepancies will be noted on exam days and students will not be penalised. However, if discrepancies recur, points will be deducted.
- 4. Technical faults will be penalised. Please make sure students are aware of basic postural principles which are important aspects of the syllabus.

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Grading of Exams

All examiners are experienced, qualified teachers with a knowledge of the syllabus, safe dance & anatomy. Two examiners mark each student and the mark is then averaged. Students are marked out of 100. They are marked on technique, knowledge, performance, musicality, grooming and use of floor space.

Please Note: Reports will not be issued until certificates are ready (approx 2 weeks after exam). All students will receive a graded report, and a certificate will be issued to all students that pass.

Grading Guidelines

The following guidelines should assist you in assessing the overall mark:

95 – 100% Perfect presentation, with performance at a professional standard.
90 – 95% Technically hard to fault, very good presentation.
85 – 90% Good technique and presentation
75—85% Average Student
65 – 75% Needs a lot of work.

Under 65% will need to repeat the level

Grooming

All students must wear the correct & current DFTA uniform Grooming deductions for:

- Incorrect uniform (5)
- Untidy hair (1) falling out, fringe in eyes and distracting to observe.
- Bra straps/tags showing (1)
- Crotch of pants too low (1)
- Unclean or holes in shoes (1)
- Jewellery Earrings, necklaces, bracelets, watches or rings (1 each)

Rules

- 1. Children under 16 years may start at the level applicable to their age group and standard. However, the first five levels must be completed before continuing on to Level 6 or Teachers exams.
- 2. Adults must start at level 1 and pass each level before progressing to the next.
- 3. Students with a mark of less than 70 are advised to do extra classes (either exam or general) before commencing the next level.
- 4. Students partaking in upper levels must be doing extra classes. One exam class per week is not enough to maintain their standard and physical fitness. A ballet class from Level 4 onwards is recommended for Jazz students from Level 4 and a jazz class is recommended for Tap students from Level 4.
- 5. Students are limited to a maximum of 2 exams in 1 style and 4 exams in total on one exam day.
- 6. No jewellery, watches or hair combs are to be worn in exam room.
- 7. Students are not required to smile during exercises.
- 8. Doctors' certificates are not accepted for exams. Students unable to undertake entire level will not be examined.
- 9. Interstate & country exams can be submitted by video or arrangements can be made to have an examiner come to your school (accommodation & air fares extra).
- 10. All teachers are required to keep a record of results and Dance Factory will also hold records.
- 11. Levels must be used only for exam work. Please do not use routines for concerts, competitions etc.

Exam Dates

Examination dates can be arranged to suit your dance school's schedule. Notify us of 2 or 3 dates of your choice at least six weeks prior and we will arrange a suitable examination day and time for you and your students.

Students are usually assessed at Dance Factory's studios. However, examiners can travel to other dance schools for a minimum of 30 students or exams (extra fees will apply for travel outside of the Melbourne Metropolitan area).

Exam Booking Procedure

- 1. Send exam entry with payment to Dance Factory at least 4 weeks prior to exam date. Entry must be typed and include the name of the school, the teachers name, the students' names (correctly spelt) and in groups, and their date of birth. Hand written lists will not be accepted. Please use example provided.
- 2. Divide students into groups of 4 or 5. If you have odd numbers one group of 2 or 3 is acceptable.
- 3. Payment must be from the dance school. Payment from students will not be accepted. Payment can be made by cheque made payable to Dance Factory, via Eftpos, credit card over phone or via internet. BSB 063 166 ACC NO. 1002 4887 (please enter your name in description field).
- 4. No refunds will be given upon cancellation or postponement.
- 5. Single entries must pay for 2 exams eg. Level 1 \$80
- 6. Only registered DFTA teachers can nominate students.

Uniforms

It is compulsory for all students/examinees to wear a uniform. Dance Factory's uniform is recommended and is available from Dance Factory.

Female and Male Uniform:

Choice of crop top, racer top or leotard.

Choice of shorts, 3/4 leggings or full length leggings.

Black jazz shoes, tap shoes, runners optional for hip hop, foot thongs or ballet shoes optional for Contemporary

Males-

Muscle top & 3/4 shorts

Black jazz shoes, tap shoes, runners optional for hip hop, foot thongs or ballet shoes optional for Contemporary

Ballet:

Females -

Leotard, pink ballet tights, ballet shoes, short wrap skirt optional.

Males-

Muscle top, black ballet tights, ballet shoes.

We feel this uniform caters to the diverse shapes and sizes of participating students. It needs to be fitted enough to show defined body lines and technique for assessment and is also a practical choice for dance class.

DFTA Examination Appeals Procedure

The procedure for appealing the results of an examination is as follows:

Cost of this procedure is \$200

- 1. The school administrator will submit a letter on behalf of the student. The letter should clearly set out any queries, or questions the student may have regarding the result of their examination. This letter should be forwarded to the Administrative Director at Dance Factory and be received no later than 1 month from the date of examination. A copy of the report in question must be attached.
- 2. The Administrative Director will liaise with the other Panel Members (Artistic Director, the two examiners and the M.D.F.T.A Advisor) who will review the letter and report, and establish what action will be taken in respect to the matter.

If the grievance is considered to be justified then the result may be re-evaluated. Of the Panel Members, at least three must agree to this reversal.

A final decision will be made and a letter will be sent to the school administrator.

- 3. This procedure is to take no longer than 2 months from receipt of appeal.
- 4. No further correspondence is to be entered into.
